IOM and Navigate

- Warrington, Halton and Cheshire have adopted  Navigate
- – as the branding of IOM across the area.
- Navigate – encompasses both the Prolific and other Priority Offender (PPO) cohort and the repeat offender cohort.



What is Navigate?

- Supported by MOJ and Home office
- Building on success of Mappa and PPO
- Extension of partnership arrangements to work with a greater number of offenders
- Co-ordinated and integrated approach



What is Navigate? Cont...

- It will manage a selected number of offenders – Repeat Offenders and PPO`s
- Both Statutory and non statutory offenders
- Targeting those who commit the highest volume of crime and have the most impact upon the community

- Accommodation and Support
- Education Training and Employment
- Health
- Drugs
- Alcohol
- Finance, Benefits and Debt
- Children and Families
- Attitudes, Thinking and Behaviour.



Key Principles of Warrington Navigate

- A partnership approach to reducing re-offending
- Consistent approach that is flexible to reflect Local priorities
- Promoting rehabilitation alongside robust enforcement
- Develop a more effective prevent strategy
- Realign existing partnership resources



Warrington Navigate

What will it look like?

- Co-located team based at Warrington Probation office
- Police, Probation and YOT core agencies
- Other agencies already involved - Drug services, Housing orgs and Alcohol Services
- Live intelligence
- Shared management
- Joint responsibility

Warrington Navigate

What does it mean?....

- Increased supervision
- Support compliance
- Swift enforcement
- Joint assessment and action planning
- Referral to (and support through) agencies
- Swift access to drug/alcohol treatment
- Addition support eg housing.
- Shared intelligence



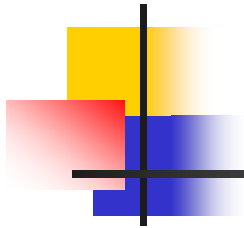
Who will be in Navigate?

- Existing cohort of 18 PPO's.
- New cohort of 20-30 repeat offenders incl. 10 Young Offenders
- Cohort consists of:
 - PPO
 - Repeat Offenders
 - DY0
 - Repeat DV perpetrators
 - ASB



How will we manage them?

	Definition
RED	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Circulated as wanted on PNC (warrant, crime or recall)• Wanted for arrest (not yet on PNC – actively linked to crime)
AMBER ALERT	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Intelligence to suggest further offending AND• Not complying with supervision / Treatment services
AMBER	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Intelligence to suggest further offending OR• Not complying with supervision / Treatment services



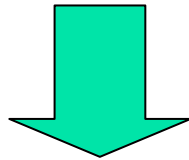
GREEN	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• No intelligence to suggest offending• Engaging with all relevant agencies
BLUE	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• In Prison and due for release within 6 months
BLACK	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Inactive – sentenced to more than 2 years in prison



Navigate performance – Warrington Q1

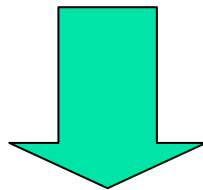
- Repeat Offenders

- Prolific and other priority offenders (PPOs)

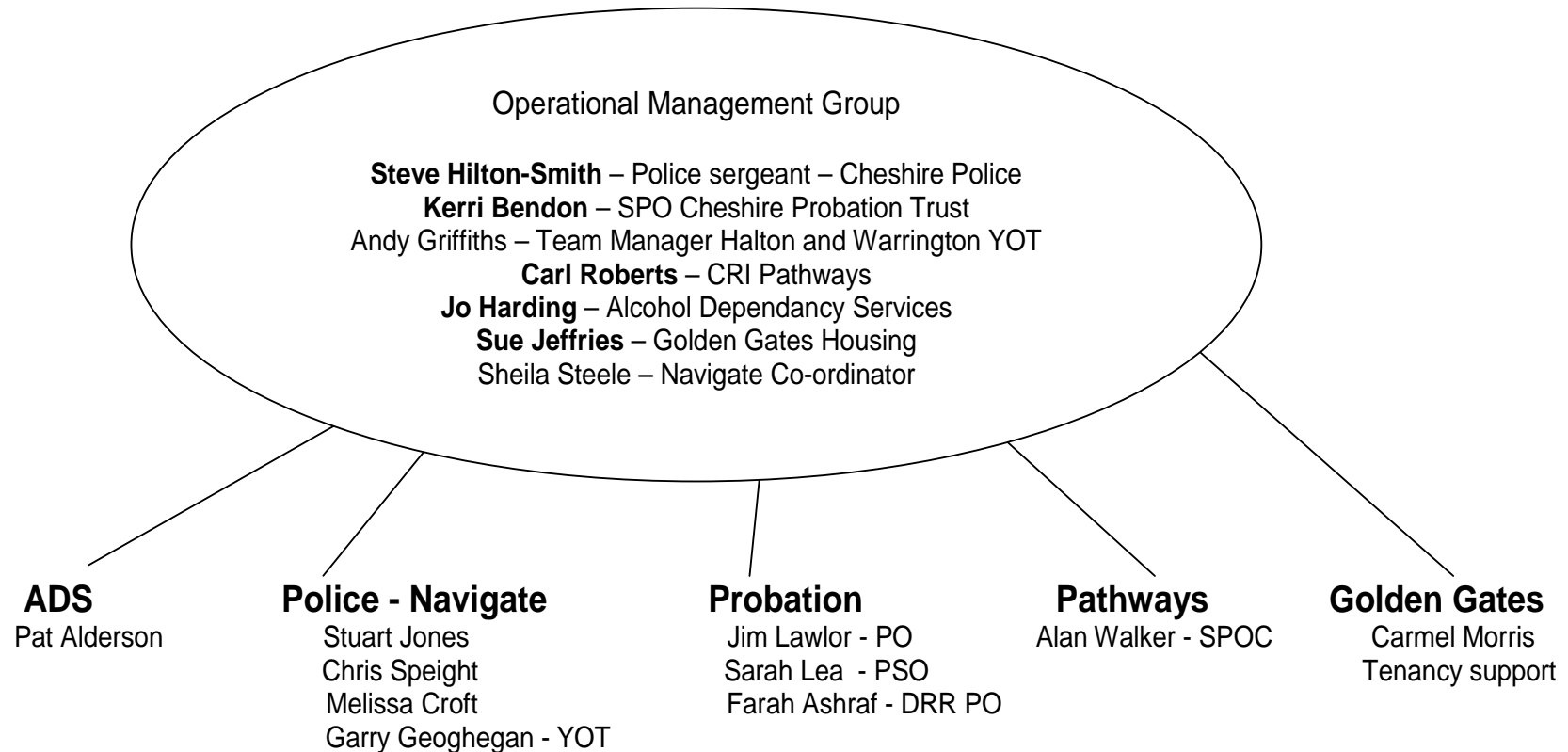

Nomination Process

- Standard nomination form for all Agencies. (process different for police colleagues)

- Nominations discussed at the next monthly Joint Agency Group (JAG). The Navigate police team will review the matrix/nomination form and collect any other intelligence needed to make an informed decision.
- The nomination will be discussed and a decision made as to whether the nominee will be accepted onto the scheme at this meeting.
- The referrer will be notified of the decision.



Opportunities.

- Integrate partnership working across a range of agencies, and understand more about what we all do, and how we can work more effectively against the root causes that cause harm to individuals, communities and create significant repeat demand on public sector resources.
- Improve real-time communication between agencies (at all levels) to inform offender management
