Application to review a Premises Licence Licensing Act 2003, Section 52

On the 19 April 2013, Warrington Borough Council ("the Council"), being the relevant Licensing Authority, received an application for a review of the Premises Licence from Cheshire Constabulary in respect of premises known as:

The Prince of Wales
2 Scotland Road
Warrington
WA1 2AG

Premises Licence Number:WBC\LP0421

On the 19th April 2013, the Council advertised the application on the above premises and at the Council's Office and on its website for a period of 28 consecutive days, which ended on 17 May 2013. During the 28-day representation period, the Council received representations from:

- (a) Paul Draycott, Force Licensing Officer, Cheshire Constabulary
- (b) Tim Shield, John Gaunt & Partners

On the 14 June 2013, a hearing was held to consider the application and any relevant representations. The Sub-Committee determined the application with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives. In reaching its determination the Sub-Committee had regard to the following matters:

- (1) the relevant parts of the written and oral evidence before them;
- (2) the relevant parts of the Licensing Authority's Statement of Licensing Policy 2011-2014; and
- (3) the relevant parts of the Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003
- (4) The Licensing Act 2003
- (5) The Human Rights Act

The Sub-Committee determined to:

- (a) Accept the proposals as put forward and agreed between all parties. The proposed amended conditions will now form part of the licence.

Therefore, the following conditions will be modified:

1. CCTV

- (a) The CCTV control shall be located in such a location that the Premises Licence holder, the DPS and any other nominated person always have the ability to immediately view and download images in a format that allows the images to be viewed without specialist equipment or software.
- (b) The CCTV system will adequately cover the public areas, including the beer garden. The recording and replay format will be such that footage supplied can be viewed on a standard computer.
- (c) Survey will be completed in conjunction with the Police Crime Reduction Officer and the location of each CCTV camera will be marked on a plan and attached to the Premises Licence.

2. Staff Training

Every member of staff involved in the sale of alcohol will be retained to ensure that they are aware of their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003, especially in relation to identifying drunken customers, identifying underage customers and how to deal with them. The minimum standard shall be BII Level 1 or equivalent.

3. Door Supervisors

There shall be a minimum of 2 door supervisors employed at the premises on each Friday, Saturday & Sunday evening commencing at 8pm until the premises closes to the public.

4. The hours to be amended as follows:

- i) Terminal hour all licensable activities, including the sale of alcohol on and off the premises to be cut back from 02:00 hours to 12:00 midnight every day the licence authorises.
- ii) The premises opening hours to be changed from 02:30 hours to 12:30 (Midnight.30 hours) every day the licence authorises.

The determination does not have effect:

- (a) until the end of the period given for appealing against the decision, or
- (b) if the decision is appealed against, until the appeal is disposed of.
