The Council now GIVES YOU NOTICE that a hearing was held on 1<sup>st</sup> May 2014

to consider the Objection Notice and hereby makes the decision:

NOT to give a Counter Notice for the following reasons:

The Sub-Committee carefully considered all of the evidence and comments submitted together with the legal advice and were satisfied that the applicant's evidence demonstrated that the historic operation of the premises and in particular the operation of the premises under some 45 Temporary Events would not impact on the licensing objective of Crime and Disorder already being experienced in Warrington Town Centre.

It was noted that Cheshire Constabulary accepted that there had been no cause for concern under previous Temporary Events and that they had not had problems with the venue during these events.

An appeal against this decision must be made to the magistrates' court for the petty sessions area (or any such area) in which the premises concerned are situated within the period of 21 days beginning with the day on which the appellant was notified by the licensing authority of the decision appealed against.

But no appeal may be brought later than five working days before the day on which the event period specified in the temporary event notice.
