

Determination Notice

Application to review a Premises Licence Licensing Act 2003, Section 52

On the 12 February 2009, Warrington Borough Council (“the Council”), being the relevant Licensing Authority, received an application for a review of the Premises Licence from Superintendent Jed Manley in respect of premises known as:

Halo
PO Box 101
Bridgefoot
Warrington
WA1 2SN

On the 12 February 2009, the Council advertised the application on the above premises and at the Council’s Office and on its website for a period of 28 consecutive days, which ended on 11 March 2009. During the 28-day representation period, the Council received no further representations.

On the 11 March 2009 at 09.30, a hearing was held to consider the application. The Sub-Committee determined the application with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives. In reaching its determination the Sub-Committee had regard to the following matters:

- (1) the relevant parts of the written and oral evidence before them;
- (2) the relevant parts of the Licensing Authority’s Statement of Licensing Policy 2005-2008;
- (3) the relevant parts of the Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 by the Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport
- (4) the Human Rights Act 1998.
- (5) The Race Relations Act 1976 and
- (6) Section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998.

The Sub-Committee determined to:

Impose/modify the following conditions to run in conjunction with the existing conditions on the premises licence.

- 1) All door supervisors to be trained/retrained to a standard approved by the licensing authority, to include training in the identification of and dealing with drunkenness, violence and conflict management.
- 2) All door supervisors employed at the premises shall wear yellow/orange conspicuous vests to a standard similar or better than those currently supplied by the local crime and disorder partnership.
- 3) There shall be employed at the premises door supervisors, each of whom are registered with the Security Industry Authority, at a ratio of 1 door supervisor per 100 customers. This condition may be reviewed by Cheshire Constabulary or Mattycoan and Co Ltd after 6 months from the date of this notice.
- 4) The images recorded by CCTV system shall be retained in unedited form for a period of not less than 31 days.
- 5) All bottled beverages served within the venue shall be served in plastic bottles or decanted into shatterproof glasses except for wine or champagne.

Reasons

The Sub-Committee decided that the above actions are necessary in order to comply with the Licensing objectives namely:

Prevention of Crime & Disorder

The determination does not have effect:

- (a) until the end of the period given for appealing against the decision, or
- (b) if the decision is appealed against, until the appeal is disposed of.

Right of Appeal
