PART III-STREET TRADING

DETERMINATION NOTICE

On the 28th February 2013 Warrington Borough Council (“the Council”), being the relevant Local Authority, received an application for a new Street Trading Consent from you in respect of the firm known as:

Snappy Snacks

During the 21-day objection period, which expired on 21st March 2013, the Council received objections from:

- (a) Mr John Ansell - Asset and Street Works Team Leader, WBC Highways department on the 15th March 2013.

On the 2nd May 2013 at 3.00pm a hearing was held to consider the objection. The Sub-Committee in determining the application decided it was necessary to reject the appeal. In reaching its determination the Sub-Committee had regard to the following matters:

- (1) the relevant parts of the written and oral evidence before them;
- (2) the relevant parts of the Local Authority’s Street Trading Policy;
- (3) the relevant parts of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 ;
- (4) the Human Rights Act 1998
- (5) The Race Relations Act 1976, as amended by the Race Relations (Amendment) Act 2000.

The Sub-Committee considered the merits of the case in accordance with their duties described above.

Reasons for decision

In considering all of the above factors the Sub-Committee, balancing the interests of the applicant and the Highways Authority have resolved to reject the appeal to grant the Street Trading Consent for the following reasons:

- The Section of footway is for pedestrians only and the vehicle would have to cross this section potentially causing damage to the highway infrastructure and putting members of the public at risk.
