
Can you advise as to precisely how the assessment of air quality levels in Stockton Heath, Appleton and Stretton will be assessed as part of what you describe as the planning process?


Will this be a desk top exercise or will there be actual monitoring using appropriate instrumentation sited in the area itself?

It is therefore an essential prerequisite that the monitoring which is done is demonstrably accurate and above reproach.

Thank you for this information. It seems a pity though that no monitoring is taking place on A49 in the vicinity of Stockton Heath, Appleton and Stretton which is of course where the development plan proposals for new housing and industrial units is going to have the worst effect.

In fact, given the huge number of new houses and industrial units its proposes in this area, it is remarkable that no consideration was given to the impact of traffic pollution on an already highly congested route. Surely as part of your preparation for the new plan it would have been common sense to evaluate the existing emissions data by proper monitoring via a designated site on the main trunk road in the area before in effect proposing to make the problem far worse. The availability of such data would have provided a benchmark for evaluation of the impact of the huge increase in traffic resulting from your proposals. Such a failure suggests a callous and deliberate disregard for the well being and health of residents of the area.


