The local plan is unsound as there is a lack of detail for new crossings over the Manchester Ship Canal and replacing the already tired three Victorian Bridges. Warrington's roads cannot cope with the volume of traffic already in 2019, creating this quantity of new houses will only create more gridlock and air pollution. There appears to be no justification for releasing green belt land as the number of homes planned is beyond the government housing targets. It seems the small villages of Stretton, Appleton Thorn and Appleton will merge into one large sprawling housing estate and we will lose our character and distinctiveness. I also have concerns regarding my work place, my family and I currently own industrial property around Warrington and we have run a local business here for almost 25 years, employing local people. In the local plans drawings Palatine Industrial Estate is shown as being developed for housing? What plans have been drawn up for the provision of relocating local businesses?
