The council plan is not sound. Release of the Green Belt is not needed to accommodate predicted growth of the population and twenty years prediction is too far ahead to warrant taking over Green Belt land which may not be needed in the future. Roads are already gridlocked through Stockton Heath causing congestion and pollution. Promises of future schools, health centres etc cannot be guaranteed and over a twenty year period, the whole area will become a solid urban mass and existing communities will be swallowed up. Green Belt land should not be sacrificed when practically the whole of the town centre lies empty and decaying and is crying out for redevelopment. There is no justification in building almost £1000 new homes a year to cope with a population increase that no one can accurately predict and provision of housing in existing empty buildings within the town would inject new life into what is now an eyesore
