There is no justification for it and it is not compliant for the following reasons:

1. It is for a number of houses far in excess of the government guideline. Warrington borough council should be challenging this number, as other small councils have, rather than determining to meet and exceed the guideline with no justification.
2. The transport plan does not accommodate the increased traffic this plan would bring.
3. Air pollution is already very bad in this area and based on the lack of a coherent transport strategy, both air pollution, noise pollution and congestion will all increase.
4. Green belt land is being prioritised over brown and consequently wildlife and the overall environment will suffer. Please justify why this is so particularly when large brown field sites, such as fiddlers ferry, offer a great re-development opportunity if the numbers of house to be built can be justified.

I would like to see a proper study that demonstrates how the additional infrastructure needed to support these developments (schools, doctors, hospitals, police etc) will be expanded to cope and how what has happened in other UK developments will not occur. i.e. buildings built but then funding to staff the surgeries, schools etc is not made available and existing facilities are expanded leading to redundant buildings in these expanded communities.
6. The various suburbs of Warrington will blur in to one mass with the loss of the green corridors which will be to the detriment of the local area and its residents.
7. Why are we looking so far in to future now when the impacts of Brexit are unknown. Our population may shrink.
