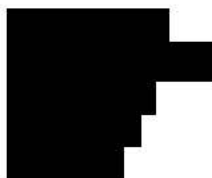
Dear Sir/ Madam,

I am writing to object in the strongest possible way to the proposals outlined for the green belt land between Appleton and the M56. These proposals will not benefit the existing community in any way. Stobarts hopes to extend it's distribution centre, thus taking away the natural habitat of fauna and flora, a farming area and area of local beauty. More houses are due to be built but Warrington traffic is already horrendous at the best of times. Our rate of pollution and related asthma is unprecedented at the moment due to Warrington being located in a geographical bowl and mostly due to the traffic. Our schools are already stretched, A&E and GP services are bursting at the seams with long waits for appointments, A&E consults and low bed space for physical and mental health needs. Our local transport infrastructure is not in place for an extra population. We are not allowing our land to rest every seven years but instead we are turning to radical solutions to overpopulate this beautiful area. What attracted people to live in this area will put them off if there is no natural space and nature or adequate services and schools. The special needs provision for children and adults alike is also sadly lacking.

Instead Warrington is heading for an economic disaster and downturn if every spare piece of land is built upon and overcrowded.

Please can I implore you to reconsider and seek alternative sites, especially for the Stobarts proposal and new houses. There is much wasteland across the north west which could be reclaimed and put to use. We could take a leaf out of the way other countries, e.g. Scandinavia, reclaim their land yet retain the unique infrastructure and character of said land.
