Dear Sir/Madam,

As a resident of Lymm, I have been greatly dissatisfied with the recent Post Office and Bank closure. We became more and more isolated from the essential facilities. Moreover the Warrington Council is planning to build new houses without thorough consideration of the residential rights for essential needs.

With no Post Office and Bank, no direct bus to the nearest hospital, with the only access with one direction bumpy road (Pepper Street) to the Ravenbank Primary School and its neighbourhood - there are plenty of improvements required to the existing area. How would the residents be evacuated in case of an emergency from the area with the access of the only one narrow road?

Another dangerous area is the bridge across the canal into the New Road. There is a pedestrian area on the bridge on its right, however the Bulls Head Pub's smoking area occupies the essential part of the pavement forcing pedestrians into the road where it is a blind spot for the drivers due to the bridge's sharp curve. Why has this issue not been addressed so far?

Please do consider essential improvements to the existing area before creating more problems with a new building site with another dangerously narrow access to the neighbourhood.
