<p>It's 30 for a reason! Campaign for lower speed limit on London Road, Stretton, Warrington</p>	<p>Ceri</p>	<p>Roberts</p>	<p>01/07/2020</p>	<p>31/08/2020</p>	<p>0</p>	<p>Dear Councillor, I have recently set up an online petition "It's 30 for a reason! Campaign for lower speed limit on London Road, Stretton, Warrington." In this petition, I am asking for the council to consider reducing the speed limit from the Cat and Lion Pub junction in Stretton, down to Owens Corner roundabout, junction with Hill Side Road and Longwood Road to 30mph. Along this stretch, the pavements are narrow and close to the road. There are several bus stops along this stretch and it is very close to both the Sports Pavilion and Stretton St Matthew's Primary school and St Matthew's Preschool. There is housing along Shepcroft Lane, Acton Avenue, Hill Side Road and Stonehill Close as well as on London Road itself. A number of families need to cross to access the school and equally residents like to walk to use local amenities such as the Post Office, St Matthew's Church, The Park Royal Hotel, the Cat and Lion Pub, Stretton Doctors Surgery, the Preschool, Kid's Planet nursery, Cheshire Natural Health and Warrington Golf Club. A reduction in speed limit would reduce the pollution levels and noise pollution in this built up area, along with improving safety for residents, encouraging greater use of walking and cycling.</p> <p>I believe this stretch of the A49 is different to that further down London Road where the road is wider and the pavements are set back from the road with grass verges separating pedestrians from traffic. The section to which I refer between the Cat and Lion and Owen's Corner is distinct in that pavement users are incredibly vulnerable to high traffic speeds and I am often seeing cars travelling at what I perceive to be higher than the current imposed limit. Accidents are also likely due to cars needing to exit driveways at this very built up point on the A49. Parked vehicles also increase the hazard as does the refuse van on bin day when I have seen a number of 'near miss' incidents.</p> <p>I am aware that you have recently pledged to transform active travel in Warrington and following COVID lifestyle changes you have seen an increase in biking and walking across Warrington. Whilst this is positive, I am increasingly concerned that walking and cycling in my local area is going to cause increase road casualties unless the speed limit on the A49 in Stretton is reduced from 40mph to 30mph.</p> <p>I was initially motivated to ask for 30mph limits because I am walking to school every day with 3 young children, aged 6,3 and 1. It is necessary to cross the A49 at a point where there are two blind spots, a bend and a slight hill, and the traffic is often coming</p>

						<p>at such a speed where crossing with small children is frankly dangerous. I previously completed an online form (ref CRM 884122) however was informed that there had not been enough accidents along this stretch of road to warrant further investigation or reduction in speed limits. I am becoming increasingly concerned about safety in this area, given a higher volume of traffic following the large amount of housing development in this area, including large lorries and construction traffic.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Below is a copy of the crash map results (<a href="http://www.crashmap.co.uk">www.crashmap.co.uk</a>) for this area, showing the accidents recorded in the last 5 years. Please note that these are all the accidents where the police were called; this does not include near misses, unreported scrapes, etc. The accidents seen below are all very close to the point at which we have to cross every day. It is not possible to walk to the crossing due to the narrow pavement from Shepcroft Lane down to the crossing at the junction with Hatton Lane.</li> </ul> <p>To be absolutely clear, with this petition we are NOT asking for humps, bumps or other expensive traffic calming measures, but ONLY for speed signs and road markings to reflect a 30mph limit rather than a 40mph limit currently imposed. Of course any alternative traffic calming measures would be welcomed if the council saw fit. I hope that you will give this request and the accompanying petition <a href="http://chnng.it/LhS4WJYK">http://chnng.it/LhS4WJYK</a> careful consideration.</p>

In short we are seeking all drive throughs in Warrington to print vehicle registrations on all packing for fast food purchased through "drive throughs"</p> <p>Why is this petition being raised?  Are you sick and tired of our roads, footpaths, parks and open countryside being littered with rubbish from large scale fast food retailers? These national retailers are not out picking up all the rubbish from our local areas; they are only concerned with their own property and their car parks at best. Our local litter groups in Warrington have collected tonnes of rubbish in the first 3 months 2021 alone, with volunteers estimating that up to 40- 50%% of the rubbish collected in some areas consisted of containers and wrappers from fast food outlets. With this massive proportion of litter emanating from fast food outlets in our area, what are these Companies doing about this issue in our local area? Seemingly, absolutely nothing. Large fast food outlets are happy for local volunteers to "take up the slack" and pick up the rubbish discarded by their customers!</p> <p>What is happening? This petition, if successful, will require fast food restaurants, through a Warrington Borough Council ordained initiative, to emboss car registration details onto each and every item of packaging they sell through drive-through's. This will then enable both Warrington BC and also some neighbouring Authorities to issue an automated charge to the owner of the relative vehicle when discarded packaging is found on the road side. Perhaps more importantly, knowing the data is on the packaging should lead to far less litter being thrown out of vehicles in the first place. Together, we can raise awareness of this major issue in our town, and help our local Councils and Councillors take these multi-million pound businesses to task for the rubbish their customers contribute to our local communities.</p> <p>How we can reduce litter in our town?
