All the Plan layers are turned on by default but you can turn them off by clicking on the three lines (what would you like to do) at the top left hand of the page, then selecting choose map layers and deselecting every layer (to make it clearer) apart from **Policy MD2 South East Warrington Urban Extension**. As you will see there is also a search box where you can type in road name etc. to navigate to the area of interest on the map.
