This revised document includes several key proposals that will impact the Trans Pennine Trail. The TPT national office welcomes the opportunity to be part of the consultation exercise as / when the developments progress. The redevelopment of Fiddlers Ferry power station site provides a unique opportunity to provide a sustainable transport offer throughout the whole of the site, investigate providing a new bridge across the canal linking to adjacent settlements and utilise the waterfront offer of the site. 3.3.30	It is important to also highlight sustainable transport infrastructure improvements as part of the Western Link project to highlight Warrington's commitment to deliver.
4.1.5	The TPT should form part of any planning consultation process on areas of new housing on / near the TPT. New housing developments should include sustainable transport infrastructure as part of its base design.
4.3	It is essential to ensure signage is provided to / from retail and leisure centres to encourage spending from visitors using the TPT.
